I would not say that the word intentional comes to mind when I think of summer, but I am learning that there are great opportunities that I miss when I am not 'deliberate' or 'purposeful'. Whether you have been around Perimeter for a couple weeks or years you have heard people say things like "life on life" and "Greet. Befriend. Invite." We not only say these phrases but believe them because we know that true transformation in our lives, our neighbors lives and in our cities, can only happen in the context of relationships. So, what exactly does an intentional summer practically look like? All of us have summer traditions that could easily turn into intentional moments with neighbors, friends and family. Dinner is hot dogs on the grill? What if you invited the neighbor? Taking the kids to the pool? What if a friend or neighbor met you there? Serving with a local nonprofit? What if you invited others to serve with you? Be intentional with sharing yourself this summer — apply it life on life and see what God does in you and those around you.

Intentional does not mean overload your calendar with more activities, but to be available to and intentional with the people God has already placed around you. You eat dinner 7 days a week, eat 1 with a neighbor. Ask God for boldness to greet neighbors and invite others to share life with you.




