

Pray for Our Schools

School Board. "I pray blessings on each school board member (try to pray for them by name). Father, may Your will be done at board meetings" (Romans 13:1)

Principal. "May (name of principal) recognize the God-given responsibility he/she has for the best interests of the children who attend the school. May (name of principal) walk in wisdom, integrity, grace, and truth" (Proverbs 2:1-11)

Christian Teachers. "Grant wisdom, Lord, for the Christian teachers in this school as they seek to live out their faith. Help them to be salt and light. Protect them from doubt and fear. Strengthen their faith by drawing them into Your Word, prayer, and fellowship with other believers." (Hebrews 10:25)

Teachers who are not yet believers. "Bring all the teachers in this school who do not yet know You into Your Kingdom. Arrange divine appointments, that they may have a profound encounter with Your word." (Romans 5:8)

Pray for Our Students

Rejected students. "Lord, come alongside those children who feel rejected by their peers or teachers. Plant people in their lives who will love them unconditionally. In Your divine wisdom, Lord, convict the students and teachers who ostracize these children." (Isaiah 1:17)

Children of divorce, abuse, and neglect. "Father of the fatherless, heal the children of this school whose homes and hearts are ravaged by divorce, abandonment, or domestic violence. Protect them from physical harm and emotional scars. Bring people to them who will pour Your healing Word into the broken places of their hearts." (James 1:27)



Failing students. "Lord, I ask you to encourage those children who are struggling with their studies. Strengthen their minds. Help their teachers and parents know how to help them learn. Protect them from feelings of worthlessness and shame" (1 Thessalonians 5:14).

Christian students, "Grant the Christian students who attend this school wisdom and boldness in living out their faith. Help them share effectively the good news of salvation through Jesus Christ with their classmates." (1 Timothy 4:12)

Pray Against

Suicide. "God, stand against any suicidal thoughts, actions, and plans that would tempt the students or staff of this school to take their own lives. Comfort and speak Truth to those who are in such despair that life doesn't seem worth living." (Isaiah 66:13, 2 Corinthians 1:3)

Violence. "Lord, stay the hand of violence against the children and staff of this school. Dismantle any plan to bring harm to them. Expose any weapon brought into the school premises and render it harmless" (Psalm 34:7; 54:1).

Pray For






