Overview

Target Student: Non-native English speakers living in the United States who want to learn more about American culture, help in raising children in the U.S., improve their pronunciation and learn new vocabulary and English phrases.

Outline

U.S. Culture, Current Events & Family Life: We will discuss current events, including seasonal events, and how these events might affect our work lives and personal lives. The purpose of this area is for the ESL student to better understand his/her U.S. co-workers', neighbors' and friends' actions and decisions in order to improve communications and relationships. The study of U.S. culture will include the study of U.S. idioms and slang.
