

Soon after their marriage in 1983, Ann became a co-owner of their family vision care practice in Castle Rock, CO. Ann moved with Erich to Atlanta in 1989 and subsequently followed and faithfully supported him during various international assignments, living in Switzerland, Germany, and Belgium before returning to the Atlanta area in 2004.
