Barbara Ann Lee, of Alpharetta, Georgia, age 86, passed away peacefully at home with family by her side on January 1, 2024. She was born on April 19, 1937, in Plant City, Florida to Oscar and Myrtle Driskell, and grew up in Moultrie, Georgia.

Barbara is survived by her husband of 66 years, Rod Lee, whom she met at the First Baptist Church of Atlanta when she was in nursing school at Crawford Long in Atlanta on her way to becoming a Registered Nurse.
