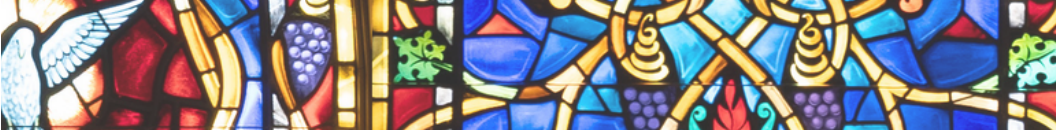

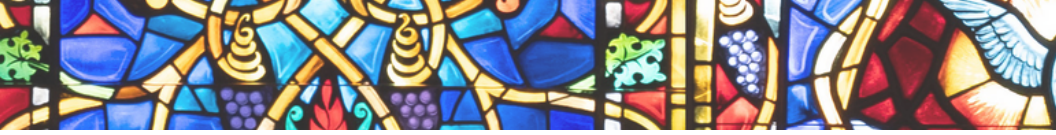

Robert Lewis Dunn, a cherished husband, father, and grandfather, passed away on October 14, 2024, just days before his 83rd birthday. Born on October 22, 1941, in Ironton, Ohio, he was the eldest child of the late Robert W. Dunn and Wilma Helmintoller Dunn. Raceland, Kentucky, is where Robert spent his early years. He was raised by his Granny and Pa in Raceland until the age of 12, creating many fond memories and stories from his time in the small rural community.

Robert “Bob” Lewis Dunn, a veteran of the United States Army, served his country with honor and dedication. He was a devoted family man with a big heart and a passion for giving back to others. Bob pursued a bachelor’s degree in business at the University of Florida, proudly calling himself a Gator. He later excelled in Process Control Management, becoming the Vice President of Sales at CSI. Bob began his career in April 1966 and retired in December 2003.
