


Charon And Psyche

The History of Truth

Thales 626/625 BC The first philosopher

Parmenides 458 BC Father of Ontology "Whatever is, is. Whatever is not, never was."

Aristotle and Plato "To say of what is that it is, and of what is not that it is not, is true."

The Correspondance Theory of Truth

What Truth is Not

1) Truth is not a pre-existing, abstract concept, a detached set of facts, a collection of ideals, or a moral code that is universally accepted.

What Truth is Not

- 2) Truth is not a type of mythology, the product of human imagination.
- 3) Truth is not mysticism or superstition that produce false religions and cults.
- 4) Truth is not subjective notions based on sentiment and emotional preferences.
