Primary Teaching (last week)

The residents of this royal community are considered stones which comprise a spiritual house designed for priests and priestesses to offer up spiritual sacrifices to God.

1 Peter 2:4-9

⁴ And coming to Him as to a living stone which has been rejected by men, but is choice and precious in the sight of God,

⁵ you also, as living stones, are being built up as a spiritual house for a holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

⁶ For this is contained in Scripture: "Behold, I lay in Zion a choice stone, a precious corner stone, and he who believes in Him will not be disappointed."

⁷ This precious value, then, is for you who believe; but for those who disbelieve, "The stone which the builders rejected, This became the very corner stone," ⁸ and, "A stone of stumbling and a rock of offense"; for they stumble because they are disobedient to the word, and to this doom they were also appointed. ⁹ But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for God's own possession, so that you may proclaim the excellencies of Him who has called you out of darkness into His marvelous light;

¹⁶ And do not neglect doing good and sharing, for with such sacrifices God is pleased.

4) Our <u>Resources</u>

Philippians 4:18

¹⁸ But I have received everything in full and have an abundance; I am amply supplied, having received from Epaphroditus what you have sent, a fragrant aroma, an acceptable sacrifice, well-pleasing to God.

4 Closing Statements

- 1) We are stones united with many other stones and as such we comprise a spiritual house where we all function as priests and priestesses.
- 2) As priests and priestesses we offer to God our lives, our worship, our service and our resources.
- 3) This spiritual house becomes a safe shelter for an abused society living without the security of unconditional love, encouragement, support, guidance, values and truth.
- 4) We become living stones and function as living stones only because Jesus was willing to be the cornerstone, rejected and crucified.
