Simplicity is the by-product of seeking the right things, so as to be freed from dangerous things, so as to enjoy the best things.

- ²¹ Jesus said to him, "If you wish to be complete, go and sell your possessions and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me." ²² But when the young man heard this statement, he went away grieving; for he
- was one who owned much property.
- ²³ And Jesus said to His disciples, "Truly I say to you, it is hard for a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven.

- 1. Buy Things For Their Usefulness, Never For Their Status.
- 2. Don't <u>Buy</u> Anything When You Feel You Have To Have It But Don't Necessarily Need It.
- 3. Don't Buy Anything In The Face Of An Emotional Appeal.
- 4. Don't Buy Anything That Produces Or Leads To An Addiction In You.
- 5. Learn To Enjoy Things Without Owning Them.
- 6. Resist Buying Anything That Will Distract You From Your Primary <u>Goals</u> Or <u>Objectives</u> In Life.
- 7. Develop The Habit Of Giving Things Away.
