Message: The Heartbeat of Jesus

1. **Creation** (Genesis 1-2; John 1:1-3; Colossians 1:15-16)
Main thought: the glory, splendor, and majesty of God's original creation was more beautiful than we imagine and pointed to His glory, splendor, and majesty.
2. **Fall** (Genesis 3; Romans 1:18-32; 6:23a; 8:19-20)
Main thought: the totality, depth, and damage of sin is more extensive than we can imagine and more tragic than we realize.
3. **Redemption** (John 3:16; Romans 3:23-25; 5:8-11; 6:23b; 8:21-23)
Main thought: the restoration, righteousness, and glory Jesus won for us and all creation is more splendid than we can imagine and more available than we realize.
4. **Consummation** (Isaiah 11:6-9; 65:17-25; 1 Corinthians 15:42-49; Colossians 1:19-20; Revelation 21-22:5)
Main thought: The unimaginable becomes reality. The renewal of all things and the full glory of God is realized in the reality of the new heavens and the new earth.

John 20:1-9

Now on the first day of the week Mary Magdalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb.

² So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him."

³ So Peter went out with the other disciple, and they were going toward the tomb.

⁴ Both of them were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first.

⁵ And stooping to look in, he saw the linen cloths lying there, but he did not go in.

⁶ Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen cloths lying there,

⁷ and the face cloth, which had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen cloths but folded up in a place by itself.

⁸ Then the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed;

⁹ for as yet they did not understand the Scripture, that he must rise from the dead.
