Romans 8:28

²⁸ And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose.

Romans 8:29-30

²⁹ For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son, so that He would be the firstborn among many brethren; ³⁰ and these whom He predestined, He also called; and these whom He called, He also justified; and these whom He justified, He also glorified.

(1) Can God be sovereign over man and man still have a free will?(2) Don't all people have the free will to choose or reject Jesus?

Common Definition of Free Will

The ability to make a choice without prejudice, inclination or disposition.

A Better Definition of Free Will

The ability to choose what one desires with no external force coercing that decision.

Natural Ability

The ability all humans have to make the choice they desire.

Moral Ability

The ability to choose Jesus (lost at the fall).

Romans 3:9-12

⁹ What then? Are we better than they? Not at all; for we have already charged that both Jews and Greeks are all under sin;
¹⁰ as it is written, "There is none righteous, not even one;
¹¹ There is none who understands, there is none who seeks for God;
¹² All have turned aside, together they have become useless; there is none who does good, there is not even one."

Fear lives and rules in the heart of a believer who has forgotten God's sovereignty and grace. If left to myself, I should be afraid. There are many trials, temptations, dangers, and enemies in this fallen world that are bigger and more powerful than me. I have to deal with many things that are outside my control. But the message of the gospel is that I haven't been left to myself, that Immanuel is with me in sovereign authority and powerful grace. I am never – in anything, anywhere, at any time – by myself. I never arrive on scene first. I never step into a situation that exists outside his control.
