Survey *Overview of the Whole Passage/Chapter/Book *Determine Themes *Background

<u>Ouick Reminders</u> Author When To Whom Theme



Observations "To notice or perceive, to pay special attention to" *Facts(name, places, dates) *Repetition *Contrasts - 'but' 'therefore' 'so that' *Verbs, Adjectives *Indicative / Imperatives

Analyze

Consider what the verse means Is there an indicative/imperative? Why is it there? - Repetition, Contrasts, Adjectives Consider the whole passage, the whole book, the entirty of God's Word

Pray!

Respond

What is being stirred in me? What am I feeling? What do I hear God saying to me? What action steps am I empowered to take? How can I thank God in this?


Observations



(some) Analysis

v2: To Timothy, my beloved child: Grace, <u>mercy</u>, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

Only in his letters to Timothy & Titus



Grace -

a) unmerited divine assistance given to humans for their regeneration or sanctification.

b) a virtue coming from God c) a state of sanctification enjoyed through divine assistance

Peace -

a) a state of tranquility or quiet b) freedom from disquieting or oppressive thoughts or emotions c) harmony in personal relations

Mercy -


1. a) compassion or forbearance shown especially to an offender or to one subject to one's power; lenient or compassionate treatment. b) imprisonment rather than death imposed as penalty for 1st degree murder

2. a) a blessing that is an act of divine favor or compassion b) a fortunate circumstance

3. compassionate treatment of those in distress

"Although everybody needs mercy, ministers need it more than anybody else; and so we do, for if we are not faithful, we shall be greater sinners even than our hearers, and it needs much grace for us always to be faithful, and much mercy will be required to cover our shortcomings.

So I shall take those three things to myself: 'Grace, mercy, and peace.' You may have the two, 'Grace and peace,' but I need mercy more than any of you; so I take it from my Lord's loving hand, and I will trust, and not be afraid, despite all my shortcomings, and feebleness, and blunders, and mistakes, in the course of my whole ministry." (Spurgeon)



Repetition:

Remember I am Reminded I remind you

Contrast; (indicative/imperative)

v6-7 <u>For this reason</u> I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands, <u>for God</u> gave us a spirit not of fear <u>but</u> of power and love and self-control.

Joshua

6 Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the Lord your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you." 7 Then Moses summoned Joshua and said to him in the presence of all Israel, "Be strong and courageous, for you must go with this people into the land that the Lord swore to their ancestors to give them, and you must divide it among them as their inheritance. 8 The Lord himself goes before you and will be with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged."




