

 - **FEAR** - not comfortable or confident sharing our faith
 - **FUEL** - not enough motivation to move beyond our comfort

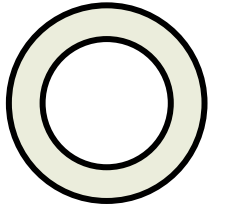
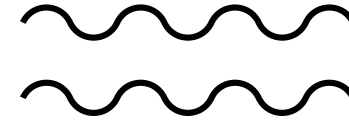
The BIG 3... FREQUENCY, FEAR & FUEL

*We don't need to focus on increasing our boldness and courage, instead **we need to focus on increasing our knowledge and experience of God's great love for us, such that we'll be motivated and compelled by love, to:***

- a) make time for increased frequency with non-Christians*
- b) move towards our fears and discomfort with confidence and joy*
- c) be motivated into action by an increased supply of the fuel of the gospel.*



At one time we too were foolish, disobedient, deceived and enslaved by all kinds of passions and pleasures. We lived in malice and envy, being hated and hating one another. **But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy.** He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior. - Titus 3:3-6

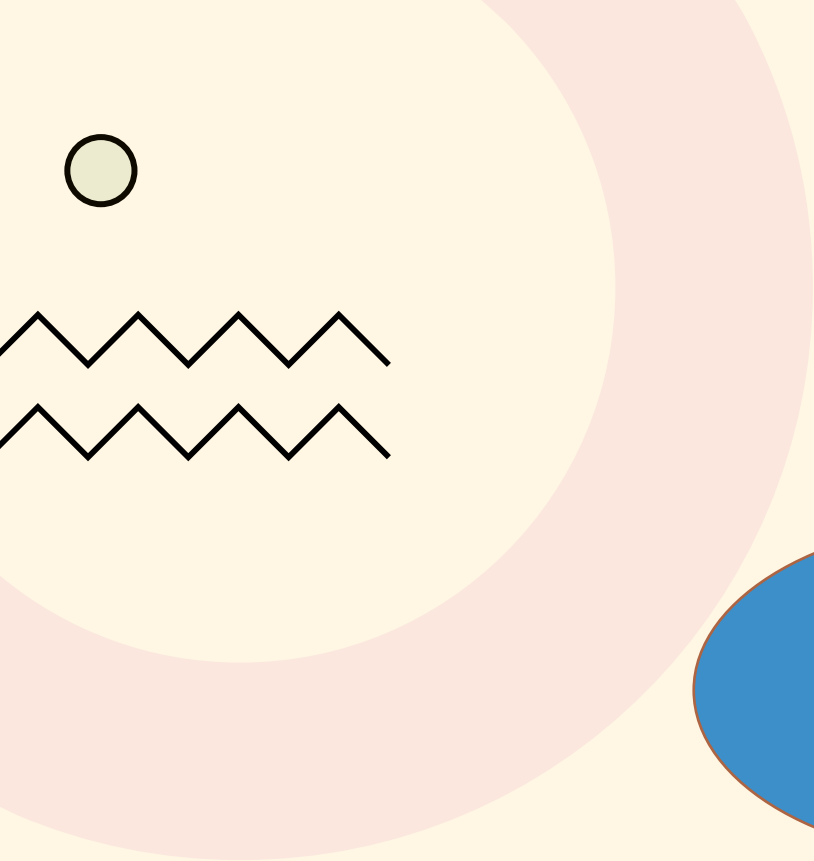
